

DPH ICD-10-CM Implementation Project - Progress Report NCALHD Technology Committee

- ICD-10-CM training for the local health department ICD-10 Implementation Team members has concluded with more than 300 individuals from the LHDs, Office of Rural Health and DPH participating in the training. All health departments participated in the training.
 - Overall, the training evaluations were favorable.
 - The Business Impact Assessment and Clinical Documentation Assessment training slides and recorded webinars for Local Health Departments/Rural Health are posted on the DPH/ICD-10 website at <http://publichealth.nc.gov/lhd/icd10/training.htm> .
 - Due to the length and complexity of the coding training and need for interactive participation, the coding training is not be available as a recorded webinar.
 - Training for LHD and Rural health staff in preparation for the transition on October 1, 2014 will occur during the Spring/Summer of 2014.
